

Some Guidance on how to fill in section 15.5 of the application form relating to Development Themes

- Lecturers should select the Development Theme which reflects their lecturing specialization and not Education which is the sector where they work, e.g. a lecturer in economics should select Economic Growth.
- Applicants who apply for legal studies should normally select the Governance theme except when the studies specialize on Human Rights which would then be the more appropriate theme.
- Applications for development studies or community development would normally be placed under Rural Development theme, except where the focus is on Health or Human Rights where one of these themes might be more appropriate.
- Studies in forestry and natural resources management would normally be placed under Environment, except when the study has a strong community development focus where Rural Development might be the more appropriate theme.
- Applicants who are applying for studies in various aspects of agriculture should select Food Security, if the studies are linked to food production, research and supply, or Rural Development where the agricultural studies have a more social, policy or economic dimension.
